Launch of the Colville SafeKids Campaign!

Our vibrant community has demonstrated its commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of our children with the resounding show of support the *Colville SafeKids campaign* recently kicked off with. This campaign aims to empower all of us to protect children from



abuse.

One of the highlights of our campaign launch was the *Kidpower training*. This included a workshop where parents, caregivers, teachers and community members came together to discuss child protection. The energy in the room was contagious - it was heartening to see so many eager to learn and contribute. The trainer said it was the most engaged group she had ever worked with! As part of this parents are encouraged to make a protection promise to encourage children to tell them if they have any safety concerns.

This workshop complimented the special training kids received to unlock their "kid powers", which are about keeping everyone safe. This included a boundary and consent safety checklist::

Ok with everyone involved? Safe physically and emotionally? Allowed by the adults in charge? Not a secret? (Secrecy is when people make it clear they don't want you to let others know what happened even to get help.)

We also had a teenage session to learn about healthy relationships including respect. Thank you to everyone for participating!

A key part of our campaign is our supporters - these are people

who will positively represent the messages about protective behaviours we can all do to keep children safe. We recently had a photo shoot with our first group of supporters. These will be used to create vibrant posters that will soon adorn our community, promoting key messages of child safety.

Update from The Colville Project

It's business as usual for The Colville Project (TCP)

You will likely have heard that there are changes with GP delivery services in Colville.

The Colville Project (TCP) Trust would like to assure our communities that TCP remains committed to the vision of the Northern Coromandel Peninsula as a thriving place to live, work and play across your lifespan.

TCP would like to thank Colville Community Health Clinic for its work supporting our communities over the past 20 years.

The Colville Project continues to work with our architectural team to design a Wellbeing and Education Centre that will be fit for purpose. The Wellbeing and Education Centre will ensure adequate facilities are available, including for accommodating and supporting the ongoing delivery of primary and emergency health care services in our region.



In addition, the Colville Community Health Trust (CCHT) continues to own and maintain the equipment needed for operating and delivering primary care in our community on a daily basis, which supports strong community resilience. Colville First Response Unit continues to provide first response emergency services through St John.

TCP is aware that there is natushock reverberating rally some around our communities at this time. However, we are also aware that the Colville Community Health Trust have supported the work to secure the continuation of ongoing primary care services in Colville. We welcome Dr. Alex McLeod Nurse Practitioner Sonia Wirihana Tawake, and look forward to working with the GP team as we finalise the design of the Wellbeing and Education Centre.

Ā Mātou Kōrero, Our Story

We would like to share our beautiful kākahu performance dress. This has been a collaborative effort to create an image that represents Colville and that our tamariki were proud to wear at the Cultural Festival recently. Jamie Watson from Pare Hauraki, shared the stories of our Coromandel Kaitiaki. The Tohu symbols are called Waewae Pakura Footsteps of the Pukeko. The pukeko always finds its way home. Just like many of our



whānau. The Unaunahi repeating curved pattern is found in whakairo carvings. For local iwi, unaunahi is a representation of the repeating pattern left in the mud of receding flood waters and outgoing tides. The koru in the design represents people and the give and take of the protection of our moana. We would like to acknowledge Whaea Aleisha for her design and Pete Sephton for making the screens and his help in screen printing the designs.


There will be more treats in store for you soon, for example sourdough cream doughnuts, muffins, cookies and dinner rolls.



Dear Community, I am happy to reassure the local community that the Colville Community Health Cen-

tre will remain open as a satellite office of a larger provider or providers.

I am grateful to welcome Dr Alex McLeod and Nurse Practitioner Sonia Wirihana Tawake from Coromandel Family Health Centre to our community. They will be working alongside our Colville Community Health Trust and the Colville First Response Unit with the intention of continuing an excellent local service.

Following the Health Locality Hui held at the Colville Hall recently it is apparent that health services must work more collaboratively to continue providing local services. I believe that the support from Coromandel Family Health Centre is critical for the continuation of Colville Community Health Centre services.

We encourage you to bring any concerns, questions and especially support to a community meeting which the Colville Community Health Trust intends to hold at the Colville Hall in several weeks time. This ill also be an opportunity to meet Alex and Nurse Sonia. Dr

Dr Alex McLeod is from Wairarapa. Kōtarani, Ingarihi, Werehi, Ko Ngāti Kahungunu ona tīpuna (Scottish, English, Welsh and Ngāti Kahungunu are his ancestors). He is a NZ trained Rural Hospital Specialist and experienced Rural General Practitioner. He was working at Taupo Hospital prior to coming to North Coromandel a bit over a year ago. Initially he was living in Kennedy Bay but is now settling with his young family in Coromandel Town.

Sonia Wirihana is a Nurse Practitioner who has been working in Coromandel for 25 years as a rural nurse specialist and prime and afterhours provider. Her qualifications allow her the full scope of primary care including

certification. providing independent prescribing, ACC and

Report from Committee of Management (COM) Colville Co-op Society

We held the AGM on 12th September in the cafe. 15 members were present (2 remotely) and 10 apologies. A new COM was elected: Joanna Pearsall, Chair, Anne Mountjoy, Treasurer, Elizabeth Mitchell, Secretary, Briar Van Dort, Pop up art project, Steve Carson, Maintenance,

Stephanie McKee, Membership Secretary and Cecelia Ormsby. Colville Store Ltd directors were elected: Jan Autumn, Tony Wasley. Still room for a third. Election of The Shareholder Authority, Jan Autumn was re-elected.

As many of you know, it has been a difficult year for the Colville Store and the Cafe, but with the co-operation of the staff and local people's support we managed to get through the year without going broke!

There have been some great things achieved too. Heat pumps have been installed in both the Colville Store and the Colville Cafe, which means the staff can take off their overcoats while at work. There are plans to put another one in the back store room too. Before next winter we plan to have a wood-burner in the



ter we plan to have a wood-burner in the cafe. The fitting out of The Bakery is almost complete, so both Rob and Spike have started baking (much to everyone's joy). Not quite in full production, but getting there.

The Colville Cafe is now officially open for bookings for meetings, fundraisers etc. **Each week on Thursday** is the *Creative Pop-Up* with Briar van Dort (and Crafternoons on the first Thursday of the Month). This is thanks to funding secured through **Colville Junction** for this year long creative initiative. The *Creative Pop-up* hosted a wonderful copper workshop on the w/e 16/17th September with John Lawry; and in November they will host a youth workshop making a mural for the front of the Colville Store, with the very talented Caitlin Maloney and Briar van Dort.

There is still work to be done to make the cafe kitchen more user-friendly and we need to restock with plates, bowls, cutlery etc., so anyone who wants to rent the kitchen space (not quite ready yet) will have what is required.

Recipe for preserving children

1 large grassy field 6 children
 3 small dogs Flowers
 Hot sun Deep blue sky
 Narrow strip of brook with pebbles

- 1. Mix the children with the dogs in empty field, stirring continuously.
- 2. Sprinkle the field with flowers, pour brook gently over pebbles.
- 3. Cover all with a deep blue sky and bake in the hot sun.
- 4. When children are well browned, they may be removed. Will be found right for setting away to cool in bathtub.







It's with great delight and pride to announce that *Predator Free NZ* has come on board the new *Pāteke Hot Spot Project!* This means we can start a new backyard trapping project to catch those stoats hanging around at the bottom of Coromandel town and at Hauraki Road. Thank you so much to *Predator Free NZ Trust*, Coromandel Area School and everyone involved with this project so far!


On a different note, a new project is being created to collaborate with different people and groups on the peninsula. In Aotearoa, kororā have been, to a large extent, understudied when compared to the comprehensive research that has been attained in Australia. Kororā can only dive 20m deep, so as the water temperature warms, their food supply may go into deeper cooler water. In much of their range, populations appear to have declined, but evidence is anecdotal or based on sporadic surveys conducted by individuals, providing insufficient data to implement conservation management actions. A comprehensive, investigative

approach is essential to understand factors driving declines and identify and enact the management actions required to reverse declines of kororā. Come on board and get in touch with us to support this mahi.

MEG would also like to welcome the new trappers starting on the RAK, TOP/ TSB and WES/HOV traplines congratulations to Ezra, the newest field team member who has completed his chainsaw training! The recent small mammal index completed in the MEGa Pest Attack has shown a great result of 0% rats tracking inside the project, while the tunnels outside of the project are showing 33%. Of course, just because the tunnels read zero rat prints does not mean there will be zero rats within the area, but we might be getting close. - Genevieve Morley
