COLVILLE BAY NEWS-297 CHC TRAPS IN ACTION

You might have spotted our CHC trap boxes around Colville Bay, after all there are a lot of them! A total of 132 rats and 435 mice have been caught since the beginning of the pest management project with a large number of mice being caught and tracked in the coastal wetland and grassland. Mice eat insects, lizards and bird eggs. They also eat plant seeds which reduces food available for birds and can slow reproduction of native coastal grasses and sea meadow. Using the upright double bar traps, which catch both rats and mice, has proven to be a good strategy for targeting both species at once.



KŌWHAI WELCOMES SPRING



The distinctive burst of yellow, and the flurry of tui in the branches. Kōwhai. There are 8 species of kōwhai, most often found beside streams or on the edges of the forest. The one native to Colville is *Sophora microphylla* or small leafed kōwhai. The nectar is a favourite for tui, korimako (bellbird), kākā and kererū.

Interested in growing kowhai to help the Colville Harbour Care project?

We can help with seed collection, supply potting mix, trays and pots, and give advice on germination and transplanting. Please contact Beth. (details below).

Hot News from Colville Brigade

The 2018 AGM saw new Fire Chief Barry(Bazza) Ross appointed. Justin Ward was thanked for his management and guidance as Fire Chief through the hectic transitional time of moving into the FENZ (Fire and Emergency New Zealand) operational system.

We had a busy time over the New Year and holiday period and then things really slowed down (thank goodness)! We intend stepping up our training with the secured mentorship of Les Ward whose experience as former Colville Fire Chief for many years is invaluable to our future success.

FENZ intends to be active in community 'fire and emergency prevention' highlighting the four 'R's – Reduction, Readiness, Response, and Recovery'. This is the main focus of our area (Region 2 – Waikato) fires have only been 20% of the call outs in the last year. A lot of our responses have been to assist 'medical professionals'. We are moving into a new environment focusing on communication with our Northern Coromandel community including our partner Brigades, Port Charles and Kennedy Bay.

Active Community awareness goes a long way to prevention and preparedness – any questions – regarding: floods; sandbagging; fire permits; smoke alarms; extinguishers; debris removal please let us know – Fire Chief Bazza 021 0858 4243.

It is encouraging to see so many new members – Bazza is eager that we get practical active training experience before the 'peak' summertime season and he plans to include Karuna Falls, Little Bay, Tuateawa, in training exercises.

We are keen to have fire practice on any piles of debris that you would like gone!

Kia ora koutou

We have heard the first pipi wharauroa (shining cuckoo) calling in the bush, so its official from nature, that Spring is here. Something great to do as you drive our country roads is to count the puawananga or bush clematis which is out in vivid white clusters right now.

Just letting you know Dr Kate is away the first two weeks of October. We will have our wonderful locum Sue Greig in the clinic over that time. We will also have Freya, our final 6th year student for 2018 with us till the end of October.

We plan to have two 4th year students coming before the end of the year too – an important placement for them as it can be their first exposure to rural practice New Zealand.

Once again we are encouraging our registered patients to link in with Manage My Health which is the patient portal which gives you access to your medical record. This allows you to see your notes, test results, make appointments and request repeat prescriptions on line. To be honest, having our registered patients using Manage My Health is a real help to the clinic as it can save a lot of time, but it also gives people a chance to 'manage' their own health. All it requires is for you to have your own email address. The reception team are pretty slick at getting it sorted at the clinic and once home or when using your own mobile device, you simply need to log in using the temporary password provided when you sign up, reset your password and 'hey presto' you are in! We are striving to have at least 40% of our patients using this, over the next while.

We have had a couple of people upset lately because they have been asked to come to the clinic rather than simply get a repeat prescription via a phone call. There are regulations in place that require our clinical staff to see people within certain timeframes, depending on what medication they are taking. We have been tightening up on this lately and urge our patients to understand that we have to see them in order to continue prescribing some medications. While on the topic of medication, if you have been to see a specialist or you have had your medication altered please alert us when you next visit as sometimes we are not kept up to date with your medicine changes.

This will certainly help us to keep you well, by ensuring you are on the right medications.

MEG Operations

Our field team have been busy over the last few weeks re-cutting and marking the tracks used to access the lines within our Rat Attack Project at Port Charles, replacing older traps and boxes as required. The weather has made this process slightly challenging and has put us behind schedule by a couple of weeks. Things are moving along nicely now though and as this goes to print the team have so far upgraded 38 km of track and replaced 100 traps. The traps are set out in 50m x 25m grids over a 350 hectare area. The work in the Rat Attack project is done to coincide with our native birds breeding season, giving their off-spring the best chance of survival.

Waiau Hawk & Morepork Sanctuary - Opinion piece

The kiwi can be protected without the use of poisons. A number of envirogroups have demonstrated that, with a lot of hard work, considerable knowhow, local knowledge, enterprise and genuine purpose, kiwi numbers can be effectively protected without the use of persistent animal poisons.

Unfortunately their work is largely over-looked and the enviro-groups which are spreading animal poisons are getting all the publicity.

The groups spreading poisons are spoiling things for everybody else.

They tell us regularly how many rats and cats, stoats and weasels, mice and hedgehogs, rabbits and even ferrets they have trapped, thousands of them, and yet they never seem to trap any possums. It makes no sense. All this trapping and no mention of how many possums they have poisoned. It is uncomfortable living in an area or catching an animal which might be poisoned. The poisoning attitude which prevails in these enviro-groups is causing a split in a community which has been here since the place was genuinely clean and green and want that cleanness back.


