PLANTING TREES AT COLVILLE SCHOOL TO PROVIDE HABITAT FOR WETLAND SPECIES.

On 17 November nine volunteers planted 950 native trees around the saltmarsh wetland that boarders Colville School. Colville's rivers feed into some of the largest coastal wetlands on the Coromandel Peninsula. Wetlands are nature's kidneys. They purify water by removing the sediment, excess nutrients and pollutants that arrive from the surrounding landscape. Although wetlands can seem dull on the surface they are in fact home to more species than any other land based ecosystem. New Zealand has lost 90% of wetlands! We are lucky to have such large coastal wetlands in Colville and it was great to see so many people out giving their time to nourish our wetlands!



INTRODUCING OUR TRAP BOXES



- . You might have seen our trap boxes along the foreshore and around the wetlands in Colville and Ahirau (Big Bay). There are quite a lot of them! We've got 357 traps in the field. Over the past few months we've had a few questions about our trap boxes. Here's some information: They are for traps only. No toxins are used to target animals as part of the Colville Harbour Care Project.
- . The traps have a double bar which means they can catch rats and mice.
- Please DO NOT open the trap boxes as the trap could catch your fingers.

As we head into our summer holiday period we remind you all to drink lots of water every day. It is essential to keep your fluid levels up as the hot summer days can be very dehydrating especially if you are out there doing stuff!

A reminder from the clinic team to request your prescription in advance please, so they can be ready well before things close down for Christmas. We prefer 48 hours notice. Remember we usually have lots of visitors at the clinic in January too so make sure you are in early for your repeat script requests over that time as well.

If you are going away for the holiday period, double check you have got ample supplies of your meds, and remember to take your inhalers and insulin. They are quite easy to forget when packing to go especially if you have left it to the last minute!

We would like to offer our sincere thanks to our patients for your help with the medical students we have had in the practice during the year. It is great that many of you are happy to have them included in your consult whilst at the practice. Feedback from our students is that they learn so much from their time with patients and they appreciate this opportunity very much - it is a highlight of their time in Colville. For the clinic team having students is a way to attract clinicians into rural health for the future, so it's a valuable investment of time for us.

A reminder that we will be closed Christmas eve, Christmas day and Boxing day, and the 1st and 2nd of January. If you require medical care during that time, call the clinic 866 6618, and follow the instructions from the voice message. Remember in an emergency call 111

Kiwi Avoidance Training - Port Charles - Date Change

Do I need to get my dog kiwi avoidance trained? Yes! All dogs, large and small, can harm and easily kill a kiwi. So if you have a farm dog, a hunting dog or even a handbag dog it needs to be trained to avoid kiwi. Kiwi Avoidance Training is FREE!

Weed of the Month - Pampas Grass

This month's weed of the month is Pampas Grass. Not to be confused with our native Toetoe, Pampas also grows in large clumps up to 4m tall with fluffy flower heads. However, there are a few ways to distinguish between the two... The older leaves of the Pampas curl at the base of the clump and tend to look like wood shavings. Pampas has a central rib on the underneath of the leaves whereas Toetoe has secondary ribs. Pampas leaves are easy to tear and the fluffy pinkish-white flower head is produced from January to June.

Pampas rapidly dominates disturbed sites preventing native regeneration and provides habitats for mice, rats and possums. The seeds are copious and spread long distances on the wind. You can remove the seed heads to prevent spread, then dig or grub out small plants, remove sizable plants where possible. You can compost, or leave on site to rot down. Burn or bury any flower heads and cut and apply herbicide to base and leave plants in the ground till the roots have died off.

And just remember, Pampas is NOT a native!




