






## The Colville Project Update




#### Want to collect native seeds? Now's the time!

Please help Colville Harbour Care collect seed. Contact Beth to get a species and location list. Colville Harbour Care is eco-sourcing seed from the western catchments from Papa Aroha to Port Jackson to grow in our nursery. Eco-sourcing means collecting seed from native trees close to where you want to replant. Seeds collected from close to where trees are planted, are better adapted to local conditions and more likely to survive. If you want more info drop into CSSC and pick up an Eco-sourcing pamphlet.

## Colville School Students complete fifth survey of life in the sea floor in Colville Bay

In February, students from Colville School completed the fifth sampling of the animals and plants living in the sand/mud flats at Bree beach. The children commented that there seemed to be more life this time. Data analysis will be completed to confirm or deny this hypothesis. The sampling is part of a nation-wide Marine Meters Squared project to monitor the seashore and track changes over time. Thank you to Colville School for trusting us with their students for the afternoon, and to the volunteers who make this project possible.

Kia ora koutou

As I write this we are aware that there is a cyclone brewing in the mid Pacific that could possibly head our way. It seems like a good time to think of our own emergency preparedness - knowing how communities in the northern Coromandel could so easily be isolated - again. One of the things that is very important - as has been shown in the Tasman fires recently, is the need to check in on those around us at such times, especially those we know are more vulnerable and perhaps less able to cope in difficult situations. Certainly an action worth committing to in small communities like ours.

Keeping our team strong is a current focus and having time out is certainly important in helping us to achieve this. It seems like a good time to mention our locums – the wonderful Dr Sue Greig, and nurses, Teresa Carrington and Julianna Williams both of whom bring a wealth of experience and skills to our team. You will have seen them around over the last little while if you have been in to the health centre or needed the after-hours service. Without their support to work for us when needed, our own team would find it very difficult to have time off with their families and also to take a well-earned break to recharge and refresh, essential for their own well-being.

Sometimes for our patients, seeing a locum creates an opportunity to have a fresh set of eyes appraise your health and well-being management. I know our team see this as a positive strategy to help ensure they are on track with meeting your health needs in the best way possible. We encourage you to make appointments with Dr Sue, Teresa and Julianna any time they are filling in, as it also helps keep our appointment calendars a bit less busy for when our staff return.

Our new Intern Ampz Mathews started on the 18<sup>th</sup> of February and will be around till the end of March. Thanks in advance for those of you who agree to spending time with Ampz whilst she is with us. Thanks also to Shivon who completed her placement with us recently.

Enjoy the fruits of summer we are certainly blessed this year! From the team at Colville Community Health Centre.





A big 'Call Out' to the community for people to think about joining the **Colville Voluntary Rural Fire Force** - we are now affiliated to FENZ - Fire and Emergency New Zealand and training courses take place to get all your skills up. FENZ respond to all 'emergencies' so we are not just 'fire' anymore. We are a remote rural community and when you or someone you know, or a total stranger gets into difficulties up here - there is only us - we work assisting the First Response ambulance team and life is never dull. So if you are young and fit and eager to assist the community come along to a meeting or give Lena the Secretary a call (866 6687).

There are lots of properties that our fire truck and tanker might not be able to get to. If you would like to invite the fire crew to come to your property so they know where your property is situated, where your available water supply is (if any) and if there are any particular hazards to look out for - please let us know. If you are a 'community' with people and houses dotted about the place - do you have a 'Fire Plan'? Does your 'Community' know how to get themselves to safety?

Also, just a reminder that this part of the country is still in a '**Total Fire Ban**' status. From the CVRFF.

#### Weed of the Month - Tree Privet

This months Weed of the Month is Tree Privet. Tree Privet is a very common pest plant in NZ. Rated as one of the '7 Most Sneeziest Plants' on a recent stuff.co.nz article it is not only a pest to our native forests but to us humans too! As its name suggests Tree Privet is tree shaped, grows to about 15m high, has dark green glossy leaves and is easily recognisable by lumpy 'warts' on its stems. Currently flowering (Nov-March) with tiny creamy flowers, followed by small purplish/black berry-like fruit with a powdery 'bloom'.

#### Wētā Motels...

One of the popular activities we ran at Driving Creek Railway Sanctuary, as part of our Summer Holiday Programme, was 'Build a Wētā Motel'. It ended up being VERY popular with a large number of children turning up to make their creations. There were enough resources leftover for the kids to make some extra 'Motels' to put around the sanctuary. While visiting there recently we had the chance to check the motels for 'guests' and to our delight almost all had inhabitants! Did you know that Wētā are at risk from rats, stoats, cats and hedgehogs? These motels were super easy to make, with just a length of large bamboo, wire, a saw and a drill, and would be a great project to make at home with your kids and a great way to help keep our Wētā safe. 
