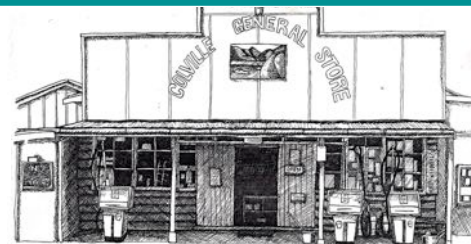
This year's festival was another wonderful event! As one community member said: "What an amazing festival – it brings the whole community together."

Kia ora koutou

Autumn is here, the cooler mornings tell us so and right now the days remain so bright and sunny. Make the most of it as winter is just around the corner. Seems like a good time to remind people to think about having a Flu vaccination - We have them available now.

Lately we have had a few people wanting their prescriptions done urgently - sometimes this is because they have run out medications which for some can be quite risky. We are urging people to request repeat prescriptions a minimum of 48 hours before they are required. In order to make this happen we are alerting our patients that there will be an additional charge for any scripts required in a timeframe less than 48 hours. *Why 48 hours you ask?* Dr Kate is the only one who can sign prescriptions, and with her being really busy and sometimes not in the clinic for a day or more - having to complete prescriptions and get them away in reality, can take a day or two. Please 'do your bit' by sticking to the 48 hour time frame - this will really help our turn-around times at the practice.

We would also like to encourage our patients who have a new medical concern to call and speak to someone at the clinic before 11am and not leave it till later in the day. We know people do this as they hope the problem will resolve by itself. When people need to be seen and we find out later in the day, it sure can add to the 'end of day' delay and pressure. We do understand there will be exceptions to this, and it is fine to make an appointment and cancel if you no longer need that time. This is a request from us, for you to consider if you find yourself undecided about whether to make an appointment or not.

Our team frequently do consults by phone, email and Manage My Health. We are currently reviewing our working days and noting all interactions with patients. It seems a good time to remind our registered patients that we will still invoice you for these consults at our usual consultation rates.
