WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH OUR PROJECT

We are currently completing the planning for our upcoming work with Beca on the concept design. They have heaps of experience in creating environmentally sustainable buildings and will be providing a Concept Package to include the following:

- Spatial Relationship Plan – high level interrogation looking at how the different spaces and activities relate to each other
- Site Plan – this will be flexible and non specific so as to be relevant to the future site
- Floor plan
- Elevations
- 2 x 3D perspectives.
- High level cost estimate

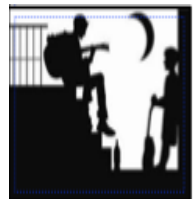

NO WASTE NOMADS TALK TRASH IN COLVILLE

Join Hannah and Liam, the Two No-Waste Nomads behind The Rubbish Trip, for an introduction to the practicalities and philosophy of waste reduction. Hannah and Liam will guide us through the 'whys' and the 'hows' of life without a rubbish bin. Come and find out about the zero waste movement. Discover how zero waste principles can revolutionise perspectives on living and lifestyle, beyond the rubbish bin, and about innovative examples of waste minimisation practice from around the globe.

This event is free, starts with a pot-luck dinner & everyone is welcome. You're invited to bring a plate of rubbish-free kai to share. Do what you can to make and transport the kai without producing waste- avoid things like opening a packet or using plastic cling wrap or tin foil.



DOLPHIN REFLOATED IN COLVILLE BAY

In late November a young Terehu/bottlenose was caught in a shallow pool in Falcon Bay, when the tide went out. Visitors and locals spent four hours in the water keeping it cool and making sure it didn't roll over and damage its pectoral fins (the ones on each side). The day ended in cheers as the dolphin swam back into deep water and joined its pod. If you discover a stranding please call DOC on 0800 362 486 (0800 DOC HOT) and follow their instructions.



Here are the 3 main things to remember!

- **COOL:** Keep the animal cool by covering in light coloured sheets and pouring cool water over them. Don't pour water down the blowhole or cover their eyes or blowhole with sheets.
- **COMFORTABLE:** If lying on their side, dig a shallow hole and roll them in. Don't pull their fins or tail or try to drag them back to sea.
- **CALM:** Keep the stranding site as quiet as possible, noise will stress animals. Don't shout, make loud noises or over crowd them.

Happy New Year – hoping it is a good one for you all!

We urge people to be safe in the sun this holiday time. Remember sun burn is a burn - it needs to be treated properly. Aloe vera is a marvelous soother, and calendula and kawakawa are also good as well. Better still remember to wear protective clothing – cotton plus long sleeves are great, or use a high SPF sun screen, and apply it regularly if you are out in the sun

We are expecting our usual busy rush over the school holiday period. Make sure you book early if you need an appointment or use Manage My Health to order a repeat prescription or to make an appointment.

We are completing work on Advanced Care Planning with those of our patients who are up for it. Advanced care planning is proven as a way for people to make known to those around them, what they wish for their future care. We will be holding a community Hui sometime in March 2019, so people can learn some more about this. We will advertise it when we have a date firmed up.

Our first student of the year Shivon, starts in early January. Whilst students are helpful for our workflow, meaning you can usually get an earlier appointment - it is your right to have the nurse or GP involved in your consultation too. It is fine to ask for this.

In November the Trustees met to evaluate the current Strategic Plan for the Trust, and to look at ways it could be updated to guide us through the next few years. The statement of Vision remains unchanged, “A strong, healthy, vibrant, safe, supportive and knowledgeable community, that is self-reliant”, but the wording of the Mission Statement will change to “*To support the provision of health and wellness-focused services and facilities, which meet the needs of Northern Coromandel, that are holistic, accessible, people-friendly, sustainable and progressive.*” This change reflects the collaborative role the Trust takes in the provision of services in the entire Northern Coromandel region, not just in Colville.

Key goals of past years remain. The Trust continues its participation in The Colville Project with two Trustees from the Health Trust also acting as Trustees on the newly registered The Colville Project Charitable Trust. Health Trust fundraising will remain focused primarily on raising money for infrastructure. New goals include attaining a higher level of Treaty of Waitangi awareness and understanding as an organisation, a focus on financial sustainability of the Trust, and a commitment to engage with community groups, funders and training organisations that can help advance the Trust’s mission.
