Happy July from the Clinic,

- Exciting news! New GP! Dr Annette Steele will be starting in July once all her paperwork if finalized. She is a very experienced UK Doctor who is keen to get to work in Colville. Her days will be Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. We are thrilled to have 2 permanent Drs now! Dr Kate will work the alternative week. Dr Kates days will change to Monday, Tuesday and Thursday starting at the end of July.
- We have a **new medical student** Matt who is with us until 16th July then we do have another student later on. Please make yourself known to him. As we are a teaching practice, feel free to let us know if you don't wish to have any of our students attend you or sit in on your appointments.
- **Blood tests** just a reminder that the GP must order these and if you have been asked to have tests before your appointment, make sure you have the forms and if not, remind the staff. Blood tests are only to be requested by the Dr or nurses. If you want specific tests, then these must go through our Doctors or a recall system by the nurses.

Advice on choking

If a person's total airway is blocked or they are unresponsive, call 111 and ask for an ambulance Back blows and chest thrusts are essential interventions in the event of airway obstruction. The aim of performing back blows and chest thrusts is to dislodge the airway obstruction and allow for the airway to be clear. Chests thrusts have replaced the well-known abdominal thrusts, known as the Heimlich manoeuvre. Abdominal thrusts are no longer recommended. If the patient is able to breathe, they should be able to cough and move the object themselves. It is important not to use back blows for a partial obstruction, as this may cause a foreign body

to move and become a total obstruction

Back blows: The person is standing or seated, and leaning forward, ideally with their head below the shoulders, if possible. Using the heel of one hand, apply back blows between the persons shoulder blades by firmly striking the area. Do this for five back blows, checking after each one to see if the obstruction has been relieved. If the obstruction has not cleared then perform chest thrusts

Chest thrusts: Lean the person back and wrap both of your arms around the person at chest level. Place one fist with the thumb side against the middle of the sternum. Grasp that fist with your other hand and apply up to five inwards thrusts. Check each time to see if obstruction has cleared. If not alternate between cycles of back blows and chest thrusts

If the obstruction has not been relieved, continue by alternating back blows and chest thrusts until the ambulance arrives.



Ferret Menace

Over recent months, we have detected ferrets in our trapping network north of Coromandel town near Waikawau and had sightings near Colville for the first time in MEG's history (previously we have detected them occasionally around Coromandel but no further north). This is alarming because ferrets are able to kill adult kiwi and we are working with DOC, Kiwis for kiwi, and others to develop a plan to tackle this threat.

Ferrets were introduced to Aotearoa in the 1880s along with the other mustelids (stoats and weasels) to try and control introduced rabbit numbers. Ferrets are the largest mustelid here. Mustelids soon turned to eating our native birds and were responsible for the extinction of kākāpō from the mainland and decline of kiwi, weka and whio.

If you see a ferret, let us know. Ferrets are about the size of a small cat, 32 – 46 cm long in body with a fluffy tail of 11-18 cm. They are variable in colour, some white or cream or may have longer dark hairs and a dark tail. Mainly active at night, they can have a home range as large as 70ha depending on food availability. They breed in September, have litters in October/ November and may live 4-5 years in the wild.

Our native species are not adapted to this predator and as with many introduced species that have no natural predators, we humans have to take responsibility to control their numbers. We're taking the threat seriously and will let you know how you can help along the way.

DOC are collecting any ferrets we catch for genetic analysis, so if you catch one in your own trap and need a hand with correct procedures, please get in touch.

Anyone who has caught a ferret or taken a photo please let DOC know. They will positively identify that it is indeed a ferret and keep a record of where they are turning up.

Stoat Trapping Network

Our stoat trapping network surrounds Coromandel town and stretches north through coastal and bush areas to Port Charles covering an area of 15 000 ha. Each line has stoat traps spaced at 200m intervals and the lines are serviced monthly by volunteers or paid trappers. Huge thanks to the dedicated people who clear rats and mustelids from the 1370 traps each month! Mega Rat Attack

We are almost finished extending our intensive rat trapping sanctuary near Tangiaro in Port Charles. In the last year we have installed 850 new traps over 200 ha area spaced at 25m intervals and are almost ready to begin setting traps. To eradicate rats from an area without a predator proof fence takes a massive, sustained trapping effort. Our field team climbs this difficult area each month and we are grateful for their stamina! Recent monitoring in our existing sanctuary has shown we have kept rats at 3.3% SMI compared to control monitoring outside of the trapped area at 37% SMI. This is an excellent result and we were thrilled to find Hochstetter frogs in our sanctuary. More on the Mega Rat Attack and our celebrations next month!

The road closures will only be in place during weekdays. (Monday - Friday)


