Open Studios - Weekly - Thursdays 9-3pm

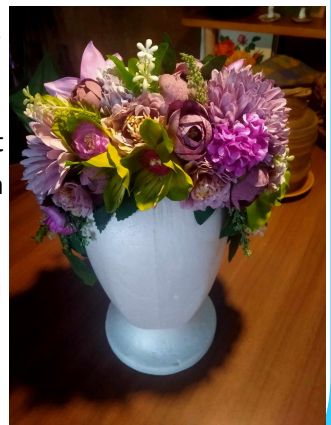
Bring along your creativity! This is a community space to spread out and focus on your projects. Briar will be weaving, come add your creation to the space, or just have a cuppa and hang-out.

Another busy month here at The Colville Project. The Board and Team continue to work towards resource consent. This has included working through the surveyor report and the quantity surveyor report. In addition, the Board and Rick Lambourne (Technical Support) have been workshopping to finalise design and development principles.

Board sub-committees have been working in their delegated areas. This has included working to progress the *TCP Weed Management Plan*, which responds to the Ecological Assessment and Recommendations we commissioned and received earlier this year.

Induction with the Team continued, this included a site visit with Katie Lowes. Katie was delighted to see the range of indigenous seedlings and saplings dotting the floor. Of course, there were weeds too, and we are in the process of embedding weed management into our short and long term planning. Addressing the weeds in our area is not an individual task but a collective one, and we also acknowledge our neighbours who are likewise working to address this issue.



We would like to thank Karen Stockman from Community Waikato, who came to Colville and ran a Risk Management workshop with the Board (*see photo above*). Having an external guide is a great way to enable us all to participate in the discussion.

We have also met with Gerard Dombroski (architect) and Michelle Wilson (CEO, Ngāti Tamaterā Treaty Settlement Trust) to discuss the Project, and both parties are considering what future engagement might look like.

We are embarking on a fundraising campaign to raise the additional funds for the resource consent process. If you already support TCP, we may have contacted you by now. 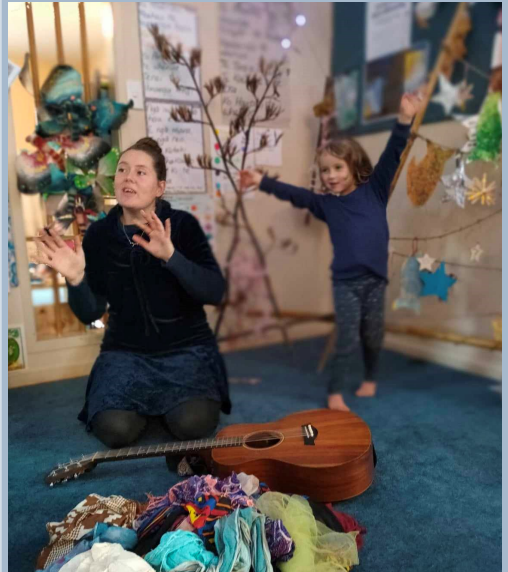
Ka whaangai, ka tupu, ka puaawai

The Colville Cooperative Society (CCS) plans their AGM for September 2023. At the AGM the membership of the CCS elect up to 7 members to be on the Committee of Management (COM) to oversee the running of the CCS. The assets include the Colville General Store, Colville Cafe and the buildings and land owned by the CCS. The COM oversees the health and finances on behalf of the CCS, that's why you may see members of the present COM doing things (voluntarily) around the Store. Colville General Store will hold their AGM concurrently. The store is independently run by the manager and directors.

We need up to 7 people to be a part of the Committee of Management to be appointed at the AGM. At present we have 5 members serving on the COM and at least 2, maybe 3, members who want to retire after a few years of service.

We are looking for ideally younger members of the Colville community, who understand the immense value of the Store and the Cooperative to the Colville community, to be a part of the COM.

The work involved is not onerous and can even be exciting as well as being of great service to the wider community. The COM meets monthly for a couple of hours as needed. Details about the AGM will be in the Pānui, on posters and sent via newsletter to members. We are asking for active community members to put themselves forward to stand for the COM, for the benefit of the Colville community.

A quick update about what is happening in the Cafe...

The Greenman Bakery is coming together. There is a new wall (thanks to Jayden and Mike for the gib stopping), a new table, new flooring (thanks to Katrina and Doug from Flooring Xtra) and new paint. Thanks for helping to Spike, Rob, Steve and others (to be thanked later) We are hoping they will be regularly baking by the start of August.



By the time you read this a new heat pump will be functioning in the Store and also one in the cafe.

Upper Coromandel Landcare Association UCLA Conservation Report

Weather and Roads: We who live and work around Moehau must deal with daily uncertainties when contemplating a drive south, given all the slips and washouts. We appreciate the work TCDC is undertaking on our shingle roads, however, there are many issues. One member suggested first and foremost all culverts and creek crossings must be cleared so water is able to run under roads. Secondly, the practise of transporting the overburden many kilometres away from slips is both wasteful and costly. Where there is no infrastructure below a slip or alongside, it makes sense to allow it to go down in the manner it would were humans not interfering or else place it as a buffer in situ.

Caged kingfish industry rubber-stamped, only 12.5 km from Coromandel town

That's right, this controversial business is coming closer as their request to expand the privatization of the sea has Coming to the sea near you, annually, are more than 3100

tonnes of faeces, hundreds of tonnes of waste from 12,000 tonnes of feed producing at capacity a total Nitrogen release of nearly 800 tonnes and 1614 tonnes of particulate Carbon. Trying to survive in a depleted oxygen environment in the warming Hauraki Gulf are tens of thousands of kingfish packed 7-10 kingfish in one cubic metre of cage space.

UCLA imagines environmental groups will begin to take notice. So far *Sea Change*, *Hauraki Gulf Forum*, *ACRE*, the Green Party (Catherine Delahunty wrote an excellent submission in 2011) and Greenpeace are silent.

Vulnerability and Abuse Awareness

We recently hosted a visit from Te Whatu Ora staff who came to give this training to staff from the Clinic, Colville Junction and Colville School. This was a valuable meeting not just in terms of learning but it raised it important issues in regards to how we access these services in our remote location.

GP telehealth service

For 2 weeks in July we trialled a GP telehealth service through Whakarongarau. At the time of writing this, we are in our first week of this service which is set up to provide our staff with access to a telehealth GP. We will be reviewing the service in early August and we are keen to get some feedback from any patients who used this service when visiting the clinic. If you have

Kiwi numbers on the rise

“Kiwi numbers are on the rise. 300 stoats have been caught per year in the Kiwi Sanctuary area since it began. We monitor the success of the stoat control by listening for kiwi every year over the winter months”, said MEG’s Operations Manager, Paul Johnson who presented on “What is MEG doing” at the Pepper Tree last month.

Paul’s lowdown on how MEG’s projects are tracking was very insightful! “In the MEGa Pest Attack, the seasonal peak of rats caught is from March to June. The breeding cycle of a rat is every 6 weeks and will reach sexual maturity in 9 weeks. If your trap network is too loose, it will leave rats uncaught and if the conditions are perfect for breeding, one pair of rats in one year can create 1500 more.

Last month was the first month of camera monitoring where photos from 12 cameras were analysed. The highest tracked species on the cameras is possums, followed by pigs, thirdly kiwi, and rats came fourth.

We used a meat lure positioned in front of the camera as we are mainly using the cameras to monitor for cats and stoats. Quite interestingly by looking at the camera footage, kiwi were attracted to the meat lure, so if you are doing Timms traps lured with meat on the ground in a kiwi area, get those traps lifted off the ground”.

Our third *Winter Lecture series* is coming up on the **Sunday the 6th of August** at the new time of 5pm at the Pepper Tree Restaurant, Coromandel Town. We are honoured to have Professor Dave Towns, an entomologist and the 2019 winner of the Charles Fleming Award for his pioneering research in conservation and island ecosystem ecology. His presentation will be on the *Secrets and Surprises on Coromandel Islands*.

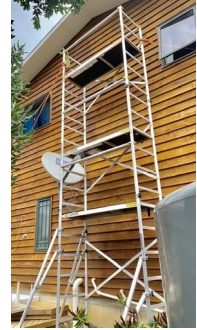
