

#### Time to collect seed

Seed has set earlier than usual this year possibly due to the warm weather. Colville Harbour Care is eco-sourcing seed from the western catchments (from Papa Aroha to Port Jackson) to grow in our nursery. Eco-sourcing means collecting seed from native trees close to where you want to replant. Seeds collected in this manner, means the trees are better adapted to local conditions and more likely to survive. It also maintains genetic variation/whakapapa. (See the Eco-sourcing pamphlet in centre of April Pānui for more info.)

## Saltwater Paspalum workshop: 5 March, 5pm

#### Colville Foreshore

This invasive subtropical grass is growing in small patches on the Colville Foreshore. We want to address it before it takes over as it has done elsewhere. Local research shows the best way to control it is to spray it with a selective herbicide. This allows the native sea meadow to remain and causes less damage to the soil and native plants than hand pulling it. Please come along if you would like more information on controlling the Salt Water Paspalum.

Being part of a working bee is a great way to stay in touch with what we are up to and how we are working for a healthy and thriving Colville Harbour.

# Fernbird/Mātātā seen and heard in Ūmangawhā Estuary

This sparrow sized, well camouflaged bird is found in the dense growth of New Zealand wetlands. Fernbirds are poor fliers. They typically scramble through dense vegetation, occasionally flying short distances with their tail hanging down. They can be difficult to see. Fernbird populations are declining, mostly due to loss of habitat and predation by introduced mammals. There are fernbirds in Colville Bay and Colville Harbour Care predator control helps

# Waitangi Day Commemoration 2018

Colville Social Services Collective (CSSC) in association with The Ministry of Heritage and Culture (Manatu Taonga) and supported by Whitianga Countdown hosted the annual Waitangi Day Commemoration again this year, Te Umangawha O Nga Waka (Colville) as this years theme.

Due to unseasonal sub tropical cyclones the event was postponed and eventually held on Saturday 17th February at Otautu Bay in fantastic weather conditions which saw around 50 people attend, to try 'Waka ama' for the first time and share in a bbq and refreshments.

Following the Whakatau lead by Jamie Ryan, Te Puru Waka Ama Club members then provided specialist instruction for the use of the double hulled waka, hoia and safety equipment.

Participants were thrilled with this opportunity to learn basic skills of navigating a waka and were also privileged to have local history and traditional knowledge shared by Jamie Ryan while aboard the waka, thank you to these Tohunga for sharing their Matauranga.

There was much excitement and enthusiasm to hold a similar event again in Colville and the significance of the Waitangi Day Commemoration was discussed after the days activity during the bbq which was concluded with a Waiata.



# **Changing landscapes**

It is not only animal pests that threaten our biodiversity.

Invasive Weeds not only visibly change our iconic landscapes they also exclude many of our native species from the areas of infestation. For example thick swathes of montbretia and kahili ginger restrict and exclude feeding or nesting of ground dwelling native species thus creating a loss of habitat. Those with wind borne seeds include wilding pines, moth plant and pampas. These spread readily throughout the area. Bird spread seed of climbing asparagus, cotoneaster, ginger, woollie nightshade and honeysuckle mean these species can be spread some kilometers from the source plants making it a huge challenge to control.

Do you know your toetoe from your pampas?

Pampas is a very invasive grass. Its leaves are razor-sharp hence its common name, 'cutty grass'. It is a serious threat to some natural areas like sand dunes, stream banks and coastal cliffs where it can completely replace native vegetation. It is a particular problem on roadsides (reducing visibility), along railways, in quarries and in newly planted forests. Pampas can be a fire risk due to the large amount of dry matter it produces. It also harbours pests such as rats, mice, rabbits and possums.

Native Toetoe have drooping flower heads which are creamy yellow. They have a white waxy covering on the leaf base and livestock are unlikely to eat it. Toetoe does not snap readily and dead leaves droop but don't form a spiral.

Pampas have upright flowering stems, white, pink or purple in color. The leaves tear easily and are attractive to livestock. Pampas snaps readily when given a sharp tug and dead leaf bases form spirals which look like wood shavings.



What can you do?

Pampas are flowering now, the best way to help limit the locations that have pampas is to break the stem and collect the seed heads. Pampas are prolific seeders and seeds are widely dispersed so ensure you dispose of the seed heads wisely.


