

BIRD COUNTS CONFIRM COLVILLE'S UNIQUE BIRD LIFE.

In May, we did 5-minute bird counts around Colville Bay. Rare and threatened birds are living here! A bittern (less than 1000 in NZ) and two fern birds were heard. A census at the flocking site in the middle of the foreshore reserve (see graph) revealed 54 NZ dotterel's feeding on the mudflats. With the population at only 2075 (2011) that is pretty special. Bird counts will be done twice a year to help us understand the impact of our pest control around the bay.

MYRTLE RUST FOUND IN COLVILLE. In June, Myrtle Rust was detected on mature põhutukawa trees on Wharf Rd. Myrtle rust is a serious fungal disease that affects plants in the myrtle family. Plants in this family include the iconic põhutukawa, mānuka and rātā as well as some common garden plants such as ramarama and feijoa.

Symptoms to look out for are:

- . bright yellow powdery eruptions on the underside of leaves (young infection)
- . bright yellow powdery eruptions on both sides of the leaf (mature infection)
- . brown/grey rust pustules (older spores) on older lesions (scars/wounds)
- . grey, 'fuzzy' spore growth on undersides of leaves
- Some leaves may become buckled or twisted and die off.

What can you do?

- If you think you've seen myrtle rust, don't touch it, take a photo, and call 0800 80 99 66.
- Collect local seed, grow seedlings and plant them. The more trees there are the more likely there
 will be some that are resistant to myrtle rust.

Hoping this finds everyone fit and well and dry!

Recent visitors to the clinic who have told us their cell phone number will have received a 'text to remind' them of their appointment the next day. This is generated automatically and helps us to make sure people remember the date and time of their next visit. We have also had a few sent in error to people who have requested something at the clinic, but who aren't visiting us. Sorry about that, and please 'bear with' as we get the new system sorted.

In August we are hosting a group of 20 health students from Auckland University for a half day in Colville as part of their 'rural weekend'. The plan is for them to meet rural health professionals and have some useful hands on experience. We will be working with local first responders, the St John team and the clinic staff. We believe investing time in this could benefit communities like ours who have difficulty attracting rural health practitioners.. We sincerely hope that from the group there may be one or two who really get 'hooked' on working in a place like Colville.

We have been having a bit of a blitz on <u>not</u> enrolling people from out of our area. A wee reminder that our area is north of and includes Tuateawa to Papa Aroha. We are not enrolling people who reside outside of this, and yes this applies even if you have a batch and can provide a local address. So sorry, but we are making a stand on this currently.

In August we have two students with us, a fourth year called Jelle and a trainee intern 6th year called Astha. These are our second to last students for the year, which reminds us of how the year is flying by.

I hope the weather is kinder to us all in August. Keep warm and dry, and be careful on those roads.


Pack in Pack out!

Operation Nest Egg

environment Our involvement with Operation Nest Egg (ONE) is winding down, with this year's Rroup breeding season coming to an end. There have been a total of 29 eggs (including 3 chicks) lifted from our area and transported to Rainbow Springs Rotorua for hatching. Of these eggs, 23 have been viable and all but 2 chicks have been released on predator free Motutapu Island.

They have become part of the founding population of Coromandel Brown kiwi on the Island. The purpose of this program is firstly to ensure there is a secure population of Coromandel Brown kiwi should there be a catastrophic event on the mainland. Secondly, to provide a breeding population that will see the return of many, many birds to the wider Coromandel Peninsula in the next 5 to 7 years.

What might be a catastrophic event? Disease, predation by dog or ferret...

At the time of writing we've become aware of a large number of adult kiwi deaths at Port Charles. Some of which have been verified as dog kills. Whilst not yet confirmed it is probable the other deaths, of which there are many, are predation by dog also. Netflix and Tapu, the two chicks returned and released in the Port Charles Rat Attack this season, are the shining light for a new generation that will, in time, return to the wider Coromandel. We must ensure we all work together to make it safe for them. MEG will continue to work with landowners and groups to undertake and encourage landscape scale stoat trapping, but to stop dog predation we need the whole community to step up.

Winter Lecture Series

The next MEG Winter Lecture, 'Catching fish using wood, bone, stone and shell' with Dr Chris Paulin, will be held at the Pepper Tree Restaurant on Sunday 5th August from 7pm. Chris's experience with natural history and ethnological museum collections includes 37 years as a marine biology curator at the National Museum of New Zealand. Chris is the author of the book, 'Te matau a Maui: Fishhooks, Fishing and Fisheries in New Zealand

Usually all for money or funding as it is now called (strange that no kiwi were tested for poisoning).

Another example of Govt efficiency would be MPI including pest plants in its Billions Tree list. This agency is promoting pest weed species including one that is illegal to sell or grow and others that ratepayers are spending up large trying to eradicate, eg Japanese Spindle Tree is banned by MPI itself and illegal to plant, yet here they are promoting it.
