## Celebrating World Oceans Day

World Oceans Day on June 8 has got me thinking. There are some pretty heavy statistics out there about the current state of our oceans, including half of all marine life lost in the last 40 years, and half of the world's coral reefs dead. More plastic than fish is predicted, by 2050. It can be hard to remain optimistic. Colville Harbour Care has a vision of a healthy and thriving Hauraki Gulf. ## What do Colville, the Yellow Sea and Alaska have in common? Godwits!



In May Keith Woodley from Pūkoro Kororo Miranda Shorebird centre gave two fantastic presentations about Godwits- one to Colville Youth Group (on the foreshore), and one later the same evening at CSSC. These remarkable birds do a 28,000 km round trip flight every year. They arrive in Colville in September, stuff themselves with food and depart for the Yellow Sea in March. Eating well in Colville Harbour is key to their survival as they don't refuel until reaching the mudflats of China and North and South Korea on their way to the Alaskan tundra to breed. In Alaska, the chicks are left to fend for themselves while the parents make the long journey back to New Zealand. Four months after hatching the young birds must make the 11,000 km trans-pacific flight south with only the sun, moon and stars to guide them.

## New Faces...

MEG are happy to announce that we have filled the GM position we advertised recently with one but two new faces. We would like to welcome Richard Webster (Field & Operations Manager) and Natalie Munns (Communications & Community Engagement Manager) to our team. ## Winter Lecture Series.

Our May lecture was extremely popular, with the front restaurant of the Pepper Tree packed full of interested individuals.

## Potiki Possums!

Over the last wee while our MEG field team have been hard at work making and clearing tracks on the Eastern coastline between Port Charles and Waikawau, including Potiki Bay. The ancient Pohutukawa, Puriri, Kohekohe and other associated coastal trees in this special area are being devastated by large Possum numbers. So large are the numbers that our team have seen numerous Possum climbing through the canopy during daylight hours while they've been working!

Access to these sites is extremely difficult so some major work has been undertaken by the team, including extensive GPS mapping of the area and thanks to funding from WRC, and the support of the landowners, the cyanide Possum control is well underway.

The initial Possum monitoring proved challenging as there were high levels of rodent interference. It would be great to be able to carry out rat control here in the future, as well as the adjacent regenerating native forest, as the area is a great habitat for native lizards, birds and invertebrates.

Commonly when we cut new tracks the tracks are given a 3 letter name for identification. The name might refer to the person who cut the track or the name of the area the track is located. The individual tracks/lines in this project have been respectfully named by our team with names from a local Maori legend.

Although it may be too late to save some of the individual Pohutukawa trees within this area, many will come back and flourish post Possum control and the remnant as a whole should recover. Therefore it is very important that ongoing control be carried out to ensure Possum numbers do not get back to this level again and that no further iconic ancient trees are lost.

## YOUTH SAILING ACADEMY COLVILLE

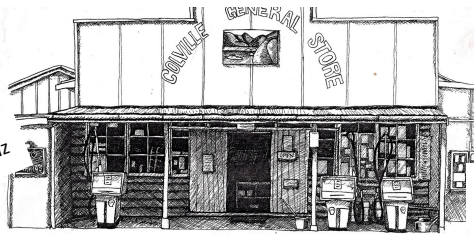

## Looking after our Birds- Can we do more?

In May I went to the Kuaotunu Bird Rescue Centre run by Annemieke Kregting. My visit was inspired by finding seven dead korora (little blue penguin) on the beach.

Scientists think that the korora are dying because the water is warming up. The fish don't like the warm water so they are swimming away out of the kororas' feeding area. This means some korora are starving.

At my visit, there were only two birds- a hawk and a baby pheasant. But in January there were 115 birds. That was hard for Annemieke, so we need more centres. I was thinking it would be good to have a bird centre in The Colville Project.

Annemieke has a range of different sized cages for the birds. She handles the birds very gently. She feeds different food to different birds. Penguins get fish and hawks get fresh sheep heart and dead mice. Annemieke weighs the birds and gives them medicine. Annemieke releases the healthy birds and has to put down the unhealthy birds.

If you find a bird, ask yourself, "Is the bird hurt or sick?" If it is, call Annemieke. If it is a baby bird and it is out of its nest, wait for a while and if the parents don't come back, then ring Annemieke too.

Annemieke is DOC licenced and she is part of the Wildlife Rehabilitators Network of New Zealand.

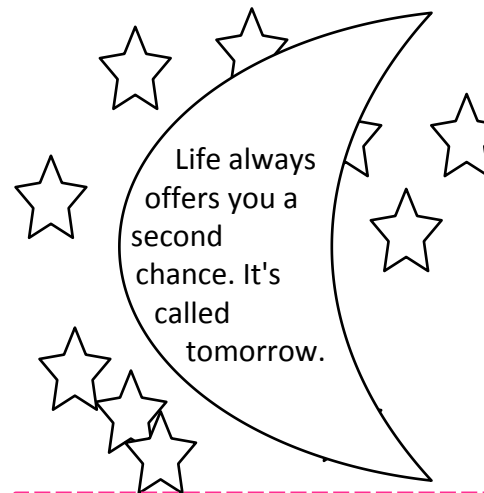

Highlighted below is an excellent, free personalized wellbeing and educational program that has lots of research backing it. The first link is to a site that offers a weeks free trial. After assessing your health type, you are given your own personalised plan which includes things like what times of day to eat, how to eat, when to eat and other advice around wellness.

### Our Organic Local Culture

Colville Store was founded in the 1970's based on co-operative principles and on promoting organic principles and practices. It aimed to walk the organic talk and it now has a proud track record of supporting organic foods for its consumers. Many local residents choose to live organic lifestyles.

**Call for Submissions on NZ Organic Regulations** Such is the exponential growth of the organic market in NZ and overseas that the Ministry for Primary Industries has just called for submissions on "whether new organic regulations would benefit NZ". **Submissions close on June 11<sup>th</sup> 2018.**

The MPI discussion paper offers a good definition of key principles of organics : " 1.Organics are produced *without the routine use of artificial chemicals*. 2.Organics are produced *without the use of genetically-modified organisms*. 3.An emphasis is put on *animal welfare*, for example animals must be able to express natural behaviour, and access to pasture is usually mandatory. 4.Organic production can also include adherence to certain *ethical principles*, for example those relating to health, ecology, fairness and care. In New Zealand, *traditional kaupapa Maori growing practices* can represent a distinct indigenous approach to organic production."

### Oranga Nuku, Oranga Kai, Oranga Tangata.

Heathy soil, food, people. This is the mission statement of Soil and Health Association founded in 1941.Colville and Beyond could be a beacon of Rongo Whenua, poison-free lands for organic industries of all kinds, for employment opportunities in possum fur and pet meat industries, for eco- tourism, walking tracks, guided tours. Oranga wai: streams you can confidently drink from and oranga kai: wild food, healing plant medicines, local organic honey and wild meats that you know are free from the risk of being poisoned. Food for thought! ( Organic of course!)
