Hi All, I am just following up on previous announcements about the St John Supporters Scheme, which is important for us all because of a new charging regime coming into effect next year.

Membership of this Supporters Scheme provides free ambulance services anywhere in New Zealand, so you will not incur a cost (\$98) for medical transport to hospital.

Joining the Scheme is not overly expensive and covers:

- ٠ you, or you and your family at the same address
- coverage for emergencies throughout New Zealand
- as often as you need it •
- for the whole year

Free accident or medical emergency ambulance services are available for just one single annual fee, individuals can join for \$50 per year, couples for \$65 or families may join for \$85 to cover all those living at the same address.

- Anyone with savings or investments, will also require a "Resident Withholding Tax" form from you bank, for the year ending **31 March 2018**.

Business owners, you will need your financial records from you accountant, also for the year ending

MEG in the Media

The catastrophe of the Moehau Kiwi Sanctuary deaths made National news in August. Of the 8 birds found, 5 have now been confirmed as predation by dog, the others are inconclusive due to lack of sample. These are the birds we know about but how many others, that aren't monitored, have been killed? This disaster has highlighted a real problem with roaming dogs in the area. If you see an unsupervised dog please call the DOC Hotline 0800 DOC HOT (0800 362 486) to report.

We have been overwhelmed by the support and encouragement offered and the positive to come from this tragedy is a community coming together to prevent further needless deaths. Our population of Coromandel Brown Kiwi is being decimated - please keep your dogs out of kiwi areas, keep them on a lead at all times and please, please have your dogs trained to avoid kiwi.

Well it is Spring - The lambs and the spring flowers tell us so. It is also a good time for many of us to think about coming out of 'hibernation'. Walking is an excellent form of exercise and here are a few good reasons why it is so good for us:

- Over five years halves Alzheimers risk
- Limits sickness, halving odds of catching a cold
- Improves heart health by increasing heart rate and circulation

- Improves blood pressure
- Builds bone mass reducing risk of osteoporosis
- Strengthens legs
- Improves balance and muscle strength
- · Burns more fat than jogging

KAURI DIEBACK CONSULTATION MEETINGS

In the week 2-6 July 2018 there were 6 kauri Dieback consultation meetings held,
the last 2 in Coromandel. The meetings were led by the Kauri Dieback Programme
Governance Group (KDPGG) with representatives from MPI, Scion, Biosecurity NZ
plus private contractors and programme managers.

Two meetings were held in Thames, a Thursday evening meeting and an all-day
 meeting on Friday at the Matai-Whetu marae at Kopu. Present at those meetings
 were representatives from WRC, T-CDC, ,DOC, ,local iwi, conservation groups,
 hunters associations and private individual landowners.

I went to both meetings and found that their primary purposes was to gain feedback from locals on all issues associated with kauri dieback. Six specific questions were asked as a framework but all responses and issues were recorded and some robust opinions were allowed and listened to. Brief overviews of past

- actions and future consultations for later this year were given.
- Some of my impressions from the meetings wee :-

The desire by the KDPGG to listen to and record all feedback was, for once, genuine.

The science behind PTA (Phytophthera Agithadicida) needs a lot more work to fully understand it for effective counter-measures.

The recognition that communication between all involved in the past was poorand needs improving

Much time was lost over the last decade through poor management and lack
 resources . The need for both speed and resources is now taken seriously.

There is no silver bullet to counter PTA and the social component involved iscomplex with wide-ranging views and ideas.

All groups – government agencies, regional and local authorities, conservation
 groups, land owners, hunter, trampers, multi-sports and tourist agencies are all
 going to have to work together to save our kauri forests.

Not least – for the first time in 10 years I feel that at last there is political will to
 act and resource the fight against kauri dieback. This willingness was reflected in
 the formation of the KDPGG.

The five Department of Conservation campgrounds in the area will no longer be processing CAMPERS WASTE on site. From this summer they will be operating a **Pack in, Pack out** policy on rubbish and recycling. They will still offer composting and worm farms for food waste, as well as educational sessions on waste reduction and management to support the change.
