Our Vision: A healthy and thriving Hauraki Gulf

To achieve this vision, we:

- Locally source (eco-source) seeds and grow native trees in our Colville based community nursery.
- Work with landowners to replant areas on their land with native trees.

This can be riparian strips along rivers, in and around wetlands, on steep erosion prone land, and for beautification and landscaping.

- Pest control for rats, mice and possums around the salt marshes, wetlands and foreshore from the mouth of the Ūmangawhā river to the sand spit at Ahirau (Big Bay). We have some exciting things in the pipeline that we look forward to sharing with you. As always, we will be having fun filled working bees this coming winter so look out for that. Stand Out Catches

We had a number of 'standout' catches this month.

Volunteer trapper Evan caught 2 stoats and 2 weasels on his line, which is pretty impressive considering how notoriously tricky mustelids are to trap!

Lettecia caught a feral cat in Port Charles that weighed in at a whopping 6kg! I hate to

think how many native species that thing had been chewing down on...

New trapper Pete went out on his first trap line with old trapper Pete and caught a weasel, a stoat, a rat and a hedgehog (yes, hedgehogs are predators too). That's new Pete's species identification training almost sorted!

Have you ever wondered how to tell the difference between a stoat and a weasel? Weasels are generally smaller than stoats but the most reliable way to tell the difference is the tails. Stoats have a long fluffy tail with a black tip while weasels have smaller/shorter tails with no black tip.

Stoat Facts

Stoats are members of the mustelid family, along with weasels and ferrets. They were introduced to NZ to control rabbits.

Stoats can live just about anywhere in NZ: beaches, farmland, dunes and tussock. They are fast, are very good climbers and are capable of swimming over 1km. They are voracious and relentless hunters and have been described as only having two reasons to live – to kill and to reproduce! Their litters can be as large as 12 kits, especially in a mast year when food is plentiful, but are normally around 4-6 kits. A female kit can be impregnated at just 2-3 weeks of age but her body will hold that pregnancy dormant until she is an adult. Therefore a young female stoat dropped on a predator free island could populate that island.

A stoat's main prey is birds, rabbits, rats, mice, hares, possums and insects (particularly wēta). Stoats will also eat lizards, freshwater crayfish, roadkill, hedgehogs and fish. If they get the chance, they'll kill more than they need for food and hide the rest in their den to eat later. They can kill animals much bigger than themselves and are responsible for killing about 40 North Island brown kiwi chicks every day! 
