



Trees that Count

MEG were lucky enough to receive funding from national organisation Trees That Count again this year. This funding has enabled us to purchase 200 trees from the Colville Harbour Care nursery, to plant with the kids from Colville School this month.





Kia ora,

Recently twenty six plus students and their tutors were hosted by Waiaro Sanctuary on the Western Moehau. They did surveys and monitoring for Kiwi and opossums. We were amazed with the results, 20 pair of Kiwi were determined to be living on the lower slopes around Waiaro, we had thought previously around 10 pair or so down lower so we were excited as you can imagine.

This goes to show the holistic attitude and methods are working, we leave the birds totally alone but harass their predators big time. Not 100% sure of why so successful but got a few ideas. Waiaro Sanctuary practises Kaitiakitanga (Holistic Conservation)

and is poison free. As no chicks or eggs are taken they are free to roam and disperse their traditional Rohe (area) thus populating Moehau.

The local pig hunters around Waiaro must also be congratulated for having well trained dogs that leave Kiwi alone and for avoiding the Kiwi hot spots as well as the farmers and landowners for giving us unlimited access on our mission.



Students comparing notes on site

C.L.A.I.M

Coromandel Lobby Against Indiscriminate Mining
A brief summary of the address by Coromandel Watchdog at the AGM,
February 2021.

Firstly we were reminded of the long history of anti mining protests here on the Coromandel and the countless hours by dedicated volunteers given to this fight. Yet still the Coromandel remains under threat. DOC Conservation land is presumed by many to be safe from mining. But this is not the case. Our Labour Government has approved an application for an underground mine at Wharekirauponga which is on Schedule 4, DOC land. The tunnel would be 6.4km long and the tailings dumped on farmland bought by the company. Hence the petition for a Moratorium on all mining in the Coromandel, which you can sign online at Action Station/ Coromandel Watchdog or at the Colville Store.

Secondly Catherine reminded us that our job as CLAIM is to focus on mining activity north of the Kopu Hikuwai line.
