We will be having five sessions starting the second week of August, the split activities this term will be **Tennis** and **Horse riding**.



Moehau Environment Group is a not-forprofit community group that has existed for over 20 years, working to ensure the native biodiversity of our region is flourishing, celebrated and cared for by all. We implement large-scale conservation projects, like stoat and rat trapping, possum control, and run programmes to interact with children and adults in Coromandel North. Spotlight on: Woolly Nightshade

Woolly Nightshade grows rapidly and establishes itself quickly at the expense of native seedlings. It can grow up to 9m tall and forms dense stands which crowd out other plants preventing regeneration of native species. Introduced into New Zealand in the late 1800's, it's also known as *tobacco weed* or *kerosene plant* due to its distinctively strong smell. Woolly Nightshade is allelopathic meaning it produces toxins that poison the soil preventing growth of other



plants, and is happy to invade almost all kinds of areas and soil types, including

coastal and estuarine margins.

It can be identified by its velvety oval grey/ green leaves, and dense clusters of purple flowers which are followed by clusters of small round green berries that ripen to a soft yellow. They are moderately toxic to people especially children.

It's important to keep on top of Woolly Nightshade as once it gets established it takes hold quickly.

It will be a wonderful celebration of the student's learning and a community get together. This time the kids are running the show!

Colville Community Introducing...

CVRFF Colville **Voluntary** Rural Fire Force Inc. Soc.

CVRFF is a 'legal entity' that has governance over a block of land - 'the Lease' [TCDC owns the land and CVRFF currently hold the lease] and owns the Fire Station building. CVRFF also owns various chattels and fire fighting equipment. All legal documents must be entered into the minutes and discussed. No one person has autonomy and no one person can sign on behalf of CVRFF; it has to be the Secretary that is 'directed' to sign by the membership and the official 'seal' must be apply to any document to make it a legal document for CVRFF.

Since 2017 FENZ [Fire and Emergency New Zealand] a government owned SOE [State owned Enterprise] has been running Fire and Emergency throughout the country. FENZ has supplied us with uniforms, lockers, shelves, smokechaser ute, fire truck, computers, TV screens, whiteboard, tables, chairs, radios and all manner of consumables and equipment. It has also offered wonderful training courses that carry NZQA Unit Standard Credits.

FENZ has just presented CVRFF with a contract to sign. They want CVRFF to sign over the TCDC Lease and the Building to FENZ - this means FENZ will own it. CVRFF had a meeting and discussed this contract and the majority are not keen on the idea.

I think it gives us a good opportunity to have a wider discussion and talk this over as a community.

What do people want to have here in the future?

We currently have 5 people over 65 in the 'crew' and one day a 40 year old 'community member' referred to our 'crew' as 'Dad's Army' - we are actually Grandad & Grandma's army because none of the eligible fit young men and women are getting involved. Since then I am happy to say we have 5 new crew members under 50 - but we do need more as the older ones, including myself, will be drifting off to retirement sooner than you think.

This is why we need your input now.

Do you know someone who will make a good crew member?

Teenagers, people in their 20s and 30s who are ready to step up and get the very best training in emergency response? The skills and NZQA Standards that you gain will increase your employability]

Do you think it would be the right thing to do to end CVRFF and give away our lease and building?

Or should we retain the 'leased' land and the building and our legal structure and continue to work with FENZ as we have since 2017?

How do you want the First Response and Fire and Emergency crew to look in 10 years?

Support the CVRFF, become involved and help it transition into a new era!

You don't have to be a Fire Fighter - you can be Operational Support - train as a Emergency First Aider - be a weather/wind guru - be a water diviner and know where all the water sources are for helping fight fires. You can do something and you can be trained to be excellent at what you choose to do.

I look forward to hearing your views and will call a public meeting in the near future to discuss these important matters as a 'community'.
