Ā Mātou Kōrero, Our Story

The recent extreme weather events have been an important reminder to keep it simple and focus on what's important. We know that all this change is going to impact our whānau, staff and students. We would like to acknowledge the focus and effort of all students when they have been able to attend school.



In 2023 we have made some adjustments to the timetable to ensure that we are planning for wellbeing so that it becomes part of who we are and what we do. This includes a 10 minute wellbeing time at the start of the day (8.50-9.00am) and after lunch (1.00-1.10pm). All staff and students continue to enjoy sharing kai together at lunchtime each day (12.20-12.30pm) as part of the Ka ora Ka ako programme. Four afternoons a week our students learn together in whānau groups (2.10-2.50pm) to build collaborative learning relationships across the school.

For the past couple of weeks we have been building huts inspired by *The Tree Hut by Wiremu Grace*. This has given the students the opportunity to explore and understand why we celebrate Waitangi Day. To understand how and why we honour our commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, in part we've been drawing from resources on aotearoahistories.education.govt.nz and instructionalseries.tki.org.nz

It's been a stormy time through the February stormy weather but compared to some, we were fortunate. The clinic was however, greatly affected for over a week at the beginning of the month with no internet or landline services and then with Cyclone Gabrielle, we had a power outage for a few days and our telephones and internet services were not restored for 11 days.

As well as our emails, it also affected our ability to send or receive any electronic medical data (ACC, referrals, results, and all medical communications with the outside world). Our telephone system outage was exacerbated by the cell towers not working in the area. The biggest challenge of all was the engineers who could not get here because of the road closures and with staff being called to more severe parts of the North Island. Our staff adapted and found solutions to continue to work in the best way given the circumstances.

A huge thank you to all those who supported us over this time, your help was immeasurable, and also to our patients who were very understanding and adaptable at this extraordinary time. It has been a great push for us to re-visit our disaster recovery plan and speed up the plans already in the pipeline to address such events.

We say Goodbye to Helen Weaver who came for 1 week and stayed 1 year. Helen came to us as an Extended Care Paramedic to work alongside Dr Kate. We have learnt from her skills and experience as she has ours. We wish Helen well with her service with St John. The laughter still echoes throughout the building.

We were fortunate to have a very experienced emergency medicine specialist come and locum for us for 2 weeks. Dr Adrian Kerner, originally from the UK, has been based at Waitamata DHB, North Shore Hospital and Waitakere Emergency Departments, working as a specialist with direct responsibility for the immediate management of the Emergency Medicine patients.

Adrian has worked around the globe and has had experience working in remote communities in Tonga and Cambodia. Adrian has also been a College Tutor in Emergency Medicine and Honorary Senior Lecturer in Emergency Medicine at Leeds University Medical School. All



the staff enjoyed and benefited from Adrian's visit and the great news is, Adrian is keen to come back.

An important note about our telephones

When our clinic telephones are switched over to the out of hours service (Whakarongarau Aotearoa), we ask that you listen to the message. This service is used when we cannot take calls at the clinic and it provides a nurse and GP service. This is an excellent service and we encourage you to use it when appropriate for your needs.

We continue to train our new St John team at the clinic and we are grateful to St John for being able to partner with us in this first pilot in New Zealand. We understand that this is a huge change for our community but it does enable us to continue to provide an essential service to this remote location. We are committed to finding ways to continue to provide the best service we can to you in these challenging times.

It may seem a bit early to be thinking about it but we are already preparing for firewood season. We are keen to be ahead of the game this year rather than trying to play catch up or use our supplies sparingly. If you can help with supplying firewood, please get in touch. We would love to hear from you.


Future of Local Government draft

By the time you read this brief report, the deadline for submissions to the Future of Local Government draft will have passed (February 28th). Sadly, very few locals have had a chance to read this 261 page "provocation" as the authors refer to it. Our already overly burdened TCDC, currently knee-deep in serious infrastructure challenges thanks to the recent cyclone and other weather crises, will be faced with additional expensive tasks (more appropriately to be accomplished by central government) leaving ratepayers with the new bills.

Sow Crates of the Sea and Spat Catching Farm application for Colville

The hearing date has been set for April 17th for the Pare Hauraki finfish industry application. On the 2nd of March comes the deadline submissions for a totally separate resource consent with Waikato Regional Council. This one is for nearly 90 hectares of public marine space for a spat catching business by Legal Shellfish Ltd which will light the seas 3km off Waiaro. The Health Centre (Clinic), like the rest of the community, lost power, phone, and internet, making it extremely difficult for more than a week to offer health care to the community. Changes are now underway to prevent this happening again, with an upgrade to an internet provider and phones independent of the traditional phone lines. This doesn't solve the whole problem though, as in a power outage a generator will be necessary for the clinic to continue operating this system. Generators are expensive and difficult for our small clinic to afford. So in our role of supporting the provision of health services we are asking if someone out there could donate either the money to buy a good generator or in consultation with us, buy and donate one that meets our needs. Kia ora tatou! Our hearts go out to everyone affected down country by Cyclone Gabrielle. What a harrowing experience it was seeing the trees bend and hearing the wind howl. If you want to help support the birds after such an event, setting up a backyard feeding station with a nectar feeder is one thing you can do. Kākā, korimako (bellbird), tauhou (silvereye), and tūī are all native bird species that love drinking nectar from a feeder. To make a sugar solution, dissolve half a cup of sugar to four cups of water and leave it in a shallow dish. The more colourful the feeding station is, the more likely it will be to attract birds.

Farewell to Terry Whitehouse

The MEG team were devastated to hear of the recent passing of Terry Whitehouse - a stalwart champion of conservation in the Northern Coromandel. Terry made thousands of rat and stoat traps in his time with us as a volunteer, and was popular with school children, teaching them how to make their own rat traps. Terry was also instrumental in setting up the children's forest Waikawau Bay, spending over 15 years on annual planting missions with the Colville School. He was actively involved in the pateke and North Island robin releases that occurred in the Moehau region, and he helped many to do backyard trapping of possums or replant native trees. He was always a practical, cheerful, sparkling personality, a person who would help anyone at any time. We miss him dearly. His legacy is large - the trapping work will go on thanks to his generous gift of time and expertise.

MEGa Pest Attack gets Possum Control

With good rodent and mustelid control already in place in our 450 ha Port Charles MEGa Pest Attack project, work is now underway to reduce possum numbers. With support from Lotteries and WRC we have been able to secure funding to install a trap network of possum traps to reduce numbers within the project area. Monitoring over the last year shows the highest density of possums is in the new southern area, so we are focusing our trapping efforts here initially with a network of AT 220 self-resetting traps around the boundary and into the core of the area. Ongoing monitoring of both the catch from each trap and wax tag monitoring of possum bite marks will be used to determine how we change the trapping network. With a baseline wax tag monitoring index of 62% possum bite marks in the worst area, we'll be looking forward to seeing the difference over time. An initial 75 traps have been purchased and delivered and are being installed now. From the first night the traps are proving to be effective with catches already occurring!

Thank you to Annemieke Kregting

Lastly, local bird rescuer Annemieke Kregting from *Kuaotunu Bird Rescue* is set to retire at the end of March after 15 years of working 7 days a week in rehabilitating injured or sick birds. We want to say a huge thank you to Annemieke for her dedication, incredible heart, and for everything she has done for our bird life. We look forward to having Annemieke come and present as part of our *Winter Lecture Series*. This will be a great opportunity to learn from her extensive experience.






