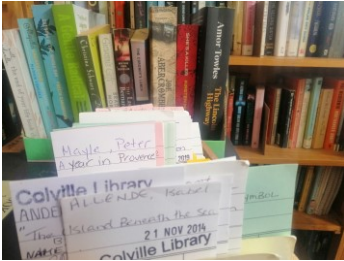

The Colville Tiny Library, one of the myriad of tiny libraries scattered across Aotearoa, is housed in the Colville Junction. It is available any time the Junction is open. It is a private, community run-and-used library for anyone in the Colville area, open for self-service and return. A community resource for community enjoyment. We have both avid readers and the occasional reader, anyone is welcome.

It has 3 bookshelves of books plus a small New Books box and has a simple card-in-the-back of each book for the borrower’s name and date of borrowing to be placed in the alphabetically-Authorred name box for books taken out. Simple to use and there is no time-length on borrowed books but it does rely on books being returned. The books are mostly fiction plus 2 shelves of mixed non-fiction. There are also talking books available.



While the limited space means we can only have so many books at once, we do try to add new books to balance the lost or overdue ones and keep the library fresh. So recommended, donated books are welcomed. Many thanks to the Colville Junction for its’ generous housing of the library.

COVILLE SINGS 2022

Swing and Blues

A Wonder-filled evening for all in Colville Hall

With twenty-two incredibly talented performers playing on the night and a challenging yet rewarding theme to work with, Colville Sings 2022 was set to be a hit. The performers and audience members alike did not disappoint.



From the moment of arrival, it was clear we were in for a special evening. The stage, covered by a grand black and gold city backdrop, established the mood magnificently from the outset, and the room hummed with anticipation. Colville’s finest musicians were gathering, all dressed elegantly to the theme and exuding a radiant energy, (whether from performance anxiety or genuine excitement it was difficult to tell!), a sure sign of their investment in the night’s unfolding. Many who attended were also dressed to impress in art deco clothing, the ubiquitous appearance of waistcoats and pinstriped suits, hats and shades, alongside glitzy and glamorous items of clothing and decorative headpieces truly gave rise to the feeling that we had stepped into another place and time.

With amusing character appearances by the evening’s host, Steve, AKA “Marcel DuPont” the audience were led smoothly through a dynamic interplay between solo performances and the big band numbers, between the soulful, sultry, and sometimes sorrowful repertoire a few musicians gravitated towards, and the upbeat, jiving numbers that had the audience and performers smiling throughout. The night was a hugely entertaining and awe-inspiring display of talent from start to finish.

The decision to allow those aged twelve and up to perform and attend also created an exceptional difference for this year's show with young performers emerging with impressive displays of talent and dressed delightfully to the theme. Among them were Ava, Ezra, John, and Issy, all making spectacular stage debuts.

Ava, who opened the show with the early swing classic *Ain't Misbehaving*, set the tone for the evening perfectly in her award-winning outfit of gold. Her sweet and soulful voice, so reminiscent of those heard on records from the era, was supported by effortlessly beautiful accompaniment from her band members including her grandfather, Tom, who completed the magic of the song with his memorable instrumental solo on the flute.

Ezra and John, who likewise won awards for their dapper outfits, played keyboard and drums exceptionally well alongside their talented parents Natasha and Paul for a heartfelt, crowd-pleasing Coromandel rendition of *Sweet Home Chicago*. Later on in the show, Issy made her impressive debut on keyboard to back her father Richard in his moving rendition of *Mr President*. Together they accomplished a truly good thing by creating the feeling that those who helped build the mighty Empire State building could be right there in the room with us.

Many bands, newly formed and long-standing, played together on the night, often featuring key brass instruments, drum styles fitting of the genre, and led by the soulful singing that characterised a lot of the music from this era. So many talented and on-to-it muso's appeared several times to show-case their talents, supporting their band members with their skilful playing and always lifting the performance level to an even higher standard.



With heartfelt solo performances from many of Colville’s well-known musicians, there was much to admire and appreciate. Each performer seemed to have selected the perfect song to complement their own unique vocal abilities and attributes. Among them, Emma’s sweet and sincere acapella performance of *On Blueberry Hill* brought forth gasps of astonishment as the pure and bell-like quality of her voice filled the room, (and personally had me near to tears).



It was an incredible and wonder-filled night all round, one I am sure many will remember fondly partaking in. A big thank you to all of the performers, to the welcoming and appreciative crowd, all the amazing folks behind the scenes, including the Colville Store crew, and an especially big, big thank you to Ella and Steve who dedicated so much time and effort to make the show what it was. Colville Sings Swing and Blues 2022 was truly a night to remember, and a timely reminder that there is so much joy to be found in music and our appreciation of it.

Members are the legal owners of the assets of the Co-op Society, which are the buildings and infrastructure of the Colville Store and the adjacent Cafe & Gallery.

Members can be proud of supporting a unique and vital community Co-operative that has survived challenges and been a significant contributor to the sustainability of Northern Coromandel for 44 years. Colville Store puts \$4k of wages into the local community each week.

Members can attend AGMs have input to the ongoing development of the Co-op Society, its projects and policies, contributing to the evolution of the Co-op into future.

But what are the Aims and Objectives, you may ask?

The original Aims and Objectives reflect the idealism and foresight of the 70's rural re-settlers, and remain relevant in these precarious times.

Here are the first 3 out of 18 Aims. They are truly goals worth supporting!

1. *To assist in forming a truly co-operative community, based on caring, trust and support.*
2. *To help establish a de-centralised self-supporting society based on renewable resources and sustainable technology.*
3. *To work for means of local productivity based on natural ecosystems, avoiding synthetic chemicals and other agents which are suspected to be of harm to the ecosystem.*

In recent years..

AIM 1. The Colville Store has been an essential community hub during these last 2 Covid years, supporting the local residents with incredible service under difficult circumstances.

AIM 2. Renewable resources and sustainable technology is even more a need in these times of accelerating climate change. The Colville Store since 2016 has a 5kw grid-connect solar system to back up its connection to mains power.

AIM 3. The policy of supporting local organic food production is a work in progress but more important than ever. This aim is an expression of the Precautionary Principle.

Addressing the work force shortage across New Zealand. Your views matter

We are in the process of formulating a community survey in regards to your clinic service. With the current health service and work force shortage crises across New Zealand, particularly in rural practices, this is your opportunity to put forward your views on what local services are needed for our community.

We are currently aligning more strongly with St John so we can continue our Ambulance, Accident and Emergency, District Nursing, and GP Team services and by investigating and trialing other options we hope to evolve a sustainable

and community appropriate local service.

Some of possibilities are community hubs where health staff visit your area, workshops focused on health care prevention and private Integrated Holistic Health.

Your views matter to us and we encourage everyone to have a say. Next month we plan to provide a link to the online survey plus information on how to access paper copies if required. If you do not have online access, please let us know the best way to get a paper to you.

Coromandel Colville Health Transport Survey

Do you or your whānau need help getting to healthcare appointments?

Do you or your whānau have trouble getting to medical appointments because of a lack of transport? Hato Hone St John has recently completed a review of its Hauraki-Coromandel district health shuttle service which transports people to health appointments such as the doctor, dentist and hospital. This service does not currently cover the Coromandel Colville area. Over the next couple of months St John will be talking with communities in Coromandel Colville to understand if there are health transport needs that are not currently being met, and what options there might be to improve access. 3 Steps for Life

In 2021, over 2,000 New Zealanders suffered a cardiac arrest in the community, with a total of 11% surviving – 1 out of 10 people. 3 Steps for Life plans to increase those chances of survival in your local community!

Delivered by Volunteer Community Educators, this programme is a free one-hour public awareness session and is designed to give New Zealanders the confidence and knowledge around basic **CPR and AED** training. It gives participants the skills to take action in responding to someone in cardiac arrest by **1) Calling 111,**

2) Starting CPR, and 3) Using an AED.

Participants do not gain certification after sessions but are encouraged to become a GoodSAM (Good Smartphone Activated Medic) responder through [the GoodSAM app](#).

Kia ora everyone!

On the 7th of October some of the team attended the Mustelid Summit at Pauanui organised by Predator Free Hauraki Coromandel Community Trust. We mingled with the other conservation groups of the peninsula such as Thames Coast Kiwi Care, Project Kiwi, Ko Moehau ki Tai, Pare Hauraki, Habitat Tuatewa and DOC and learned some new tips relevant for our work.

One of the guest speakers, Dr Andrew Veale gave an exceptional account of some of his groundbreaking research on Stoat Ecology and Genetics (he became the first person in the world to unravel the stoats DNA). He has worked closely with the organisation Te Korowai o Waiheke, helping Waiheke Island become predator free and, is also teaching other conservation professionals about catching stoats. He has a pet stoat Aria, who teaches him about her behaviour. "Stoats like novelty, every stoat is different so try different things. If you're trying to catch a stoat, bring out your 'A' game temporarily then take it away. Change". So this month we are trialing a new lure in our traps to give the stoats a surprise. The team at NZ Auto Traps have supplied us with some of their top secret lure, and if you are wondering why we were asking for milk bottle tops, we are going to supply our trappers with the milk bottle tops to put a dollop of lure in each of our 1500 traps. 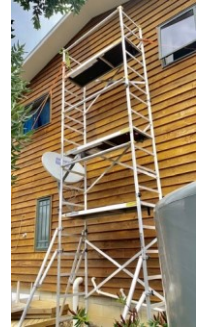
