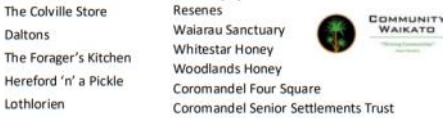

Thank you Colville!



With your help, we have **planted over 13,000 native trees, filled 11,000 pots** in the nursery,



sowed **hundreds of seeds** and **transplanted 500 flaxes...** all in only 5 months !

It has been a fantastic season with a great team of tree planters and wonderful volunteers. A huge thanks to all the landowners that have worked with us to fence and plant their wetlands and river margins. We are so excited to see how our plantings grow over the coming years. There is still some work to do in the nursery to transplant Tī Kōuka (cabbage tree) and Harakeke (flax)

seedlings before Christmas.

Marine Meters Squared – MM2

Twice per year we take students from Colville School to Bree Beach to count and find out what species are living in the sandflats of Colville Bay. We also measure the distance from the surface to the anoxic (without oxygen) layer, where the sand changes from brown to black, with the darker sand having less oxygen. This gives us an idea of the health of the sandflats. If the anoxic layer is close to the surface it means the sandflats are unhealthy and it would be unlikely to find much living there. Plants and animals are great for bringing oxygen into the sediments. Plant roots create channels for air to move through and so do burrowing animals.



Seagrass as an Indicator Species.

An indicator species is an organism whose presence, absence or abundance reflects a specific environmental

condition. Seagrasses are often used as indicator species because they are sensitive to environmental changes. There is a small amount of seagrass growing near the low tide mark. We hope that by reducing sediments going into the harbour the seagrass beds will re-establish in Colville Bay.

Why do we care about seagrass?

Seagrass:

- ◆ Is rated the 3rd most valuable ecosystem globally
- ◆ Occupies 0.1% of seafloor but stores 12% of ocean carbon
- ◆ Traps and transforms nutrients (1 ha absorbs 1.2 kg N per year)
- ◆ Pumps oxygen into water & sediments (1 m2 releases 10L per day)
- ◆ Stabilises the seabed with its extensive network of roots &

rhizomes

- ◆ Is a foraging and feeding ground and refuge for marine life
- ◆ Contributes to biodiversity by being the only flowering marine plant.

The measles outbreak currently is a big concern in the health arena. Some key pointers for all:

- ◆ know the early symptoms: high fever, cough, runny nose
- ◆ know the later symptoms: high fever, rash
- ◆ if you or your whānau have symptoms, or have been in close contact with someone with measles, please stay at home and call your nurse, doctor or Healthline (0800 611 166)
- ◆ Call before going to the clinic – help protect others by not spreading measles
- ◆ Ring the clinic to see if your whānau are immune – if not you may want to consider booking in to get the vaccine.

A big thanks to those of you who attended the Advanced Care Planning (ACP) hui on 10th September – it was a great turnout considering the weather. Some of you asked about a website to find out some facts about legal matters and options when dealing with end of life. As promised Karlyne, (our facilitator) sent this web site through

On first glance it is pretty comprehensive and it certainly clarifies grey areas. It is our plan to hold another ACP hui in the new year, so if you missed this one, watch out for our next event.

In October we will be having a trial of **closing the clinic from 12-30 to 1 pm**, to give everyone a proper lunch time. Remember if you have an emergency situation please call 111. If you strike the message that says we are closed for lunch do call us after 1pm. If you come to the clinic you will see the closed sign, so please wait till we reopen the door. This is just a trial, and we will let you know if this is to be a permanent change.

Our 6th year trainee interns have finished now, though we have three more fourth year students to come. It has been busy, but we know that all of the students have had a great experience here in Colville, and our patients have been key to that, so a great big thank you to you for helping us host them.

Colville Fire Brigade Hot News!

Colville Rural Fire Brigade held it's AGM Mon 16th September 2019 with a well attended role call and full agenda for discussion. It was a pleasure to note that the brigade is: fiscally sound, substantially well-equipped, training comprehensively for the future and maintaining a diverse and enthusiastic membership. A special pleasure to welcome back Dave, Tim and Chris and newbie Hagen into the brigade ranks. Elected officers for the forthcoming year are: Secretary Lena MacLeod, Treasurer Ngaire Evans, CFO Bazza Ross and Deputy CFO Doug Morrison. The Colville Brigade registered 22 members with 3 in the process. There is always room for more as Mr Ross reiterated not everyone may want to attend a MVA or run up a hill with a fire hose. Traffic Control, Radio Ops, Health, Safety and Welfare, Marshaling Helicopter LZ, Pump Operators, Drivers, Equipment Maintenance are just some of the roles necessary for the coming summer season.

Colville Brigade have projected future development projects to include: Youth Activity support in our community (our future crew members), Community Support Projects (AED), expansion of facilities, extensive training as support for the other operatives in the Northern Coromandel, i.e. St John, Coromandel Emergency Rescue Unit and Coastguard Rescue. We now attend a monthly combined training with Coromandel Brigade and other rural brigades in this area.

We have been allocated an all new 4x4 double cab and Rural Pump Engine. It is hoped to take possession of the Iveco Fire Truck in late October in preparation for the summer fire season. We now have 8 Medical Co-Responder capability crewmembers who qualified with extensive medical training in support CPR, Trauma Response and Pit Crew

Medical Support for St John Ambulance.

We are very grateful for support from The Bizarre Community Trust, and others, whose generosity helps us provide for the safety and welfare of our Northern Coromandel communities.

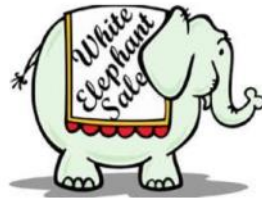
