# Colville boy wins gold at the commonwealth games!

Andrew Jeffcoat won a gold medal at the 50m backstroke final at this years commonwealth games in Birmingham. As Andrew's dad Karl said on Radio NZ "pretty good for a young fella from Colville." Andrew's story is one of overcoming adversity, including the sudden death of his long time coach Ken Nixon in 2019 and getting Covid just two days after qualifying for the Commonwealth games.

Andrew described his win as "probably the best feeling I've ever had."

# Wow, lots of information from the clinic this month!

Vacancy Fixed term – Temporary Medical Receptionist - We are looking for an enthusiastic person to join our team at Colville Community Health Centre as a medical receptionist for 6 months maternity cover. This position is for 3 days per fortnight. Skills needed are good telephone manner, enjoys customer service and confident with I.T. Training will be given. The door is open - We now welcome you in to our waiting room at the clinic but you may prefer to wait in your car. If you do prefer to wait outside then please come to the window or door, or telephone us to tell us you are here.

Blood tests – The blood test booking slots are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday 10am – 11am or 9am if you have been told it is a fasting blood test.

Emergency Prescriptions – If you run out of your medication and we are unable to fill your prescription urgently due to staffing or timing, the pharmacy will issue you 3 day emergency prescription for all repeat medications.

Winner - We have recently been gifted a lovely hamper courtesy of the Cervical Screening Programme and if you book in for a cervical smear at the

clinic in the month of August and September you will go into the draw to win it.

Important information regarding enrolling at the clinic

Enrolments at the clinic can be a laborious task, whether you are a new patient or your enrolment has expired because you haven't been seen for 3 years. The enrolment process ensures that funding is allocated to those who are entitled to it and that the clinic can provide the best service to you. It also ensures we are meeting our audit requirements.

If you no longer live at the above address and now live outside of our area which runs from Papa Aroha to Tuateawa, and with the changes to the health system which took effect from 1st July, our advice is that you register with a GP near your residence. This recommendation is based on 2 things; 1) how funding for health care is allocated and 2) We are unable to give you emergency support being too far away and you may end up using ambulance/hospital services when you could have stayed with your local primary care service

More information regarding funding and services if you are living out of area but are registered with the Colville Clinic.

In NZ, health funding in rural areas goes to the GP clinic you are registered with. This money pays for a 24/7 local service. If you register with a clinic which is not in your local area you take funding out of the area you live in and this affects the viability of a local service. This results in a loss of service providers locally

which we as a remote rural clinic do not support. If a patient registers with our clinic but lives outside of our geographical area we cannot provide home visits as this is geographically impossible. If the patient telephones requiring a home visit and we cannot provide it, the patient may end up needing the ambulance service when a local primary care service

would in fact be the better option. Again we do not support this situation as it results in a potentially unsafe situation for patients who may not understand all of the risks associated with being registered out of area.

# Colville Co-operative Society Ltd

Since the early settlers in the 1860's, many people have been attracted to the northern Coromandel Peninsula by its beauty, peacefulness and the opportunity to live in a less stressful life. With its numerous idyllic seaside bays and beaches, it's winding roads and rugged landscape with vast open spaces, it really is a place to go to get away from it all.

The unspoiled native forest, houses, many rare species of native birds including Kaka and brown kiwis, and some of the flowers and plants on the upper reaches of Mt Moehau are unique to the area.

Twenty eight kilometers north of Coromandel town is Colville, a small rural village consisting of the Peninsula's most northern store, café and post office. It is also the last stop to buy petrol and supplies if you are heading north. The store is an essential focal point of Colville life and a mirror to its well-being. The store stocks various goods ranging from bulk food, hardware, clothing, and some locally grown produce and gifts made by the community.

# In days gone by...

The Colville Cooperative Society commenced in 1978 as a food buying cooperative to supplement the then failing Colville Store.



The Cooperative purchased the buildings in 1979.

It converted the house attached to the store into a weekend nightly restaurant. This was made possible by the financial support of Alistair McKee, and the drive, business and accounting skills of Phillip Anderson and Peter Cummings and a large supporting group of (mostly) new locals who ran the store, restaurant and the 'Roadrunner' travelling shop to campgrounds.

The key to the Society was its cooperative nature where there were no particular owners, shared and cooperative work style, relatively even management structure, many hours of unpaid support by many involved and a deep belief in it as an essential part of Colville's fabric of life.

From the beginning the emphasis was to have as many part-time, shared jobs in the Store spread through the community rather than fewer full-time jobs. This coincided with an influx of new people to the area who believed in a more community style of living.



The Society has maintained its businesses and supported the growth of other Colville social groups and activities both as an initiator and umbrella organisation for over three decades and remains not only one of the few rural general stores left but still an essential part of Colville village and its surrounding area. It is a genuine 'tourist icon' as well.

Over the decades it has altered and tweaked its running structures, both directly run and leased the Cafe as it morphed into a cafe/restaurant, supporting the cafe financially at times to keep it viable as an important facility to Colville village, while always maintaining its open co-operative nature. The daily Store management system, as separate from the Society itself, has altered and changed over the decades as needs dictated but remained co-operative with high staff input to the running of the Store.

# The Structure of the Society:

Colville Co-operative Society Ltd is incorporated to the Industrial and Provident Society and is the owner of the buildings at 2314 Colville Rd, the businesses of the Colville General Store Ltd and the Colville Cafe.

The Co-operative Society is owned by the members of the society, effectively an open Society that any local person may join and contribute to. The societies register is made up of several hundred people.

At the AGM of the Society, a Committee of Management is elected to oversee the governance of the Society on behalf of its members. Its primary role is to maintain the aims and objectives of the Society and the rules imposed from past AGMs. Historically, this committee oversees and maintains the buildings. Further, it will initiate and participate in and support any community activities deemed worthy of support.

The CCS has a Chairperson, Treasurer, Secretary and a committee with the option of sub-committee if required. These are all volunteers.



# I thought it was time to introduce myself - my names Liam Atkins and I am the founder of a company called Select Solutions,

- 3. Supporting locals to do more online and be less digitally isolated as well as supporting local clubs and business. Investing back into the communities that support us.

We then decided to invest heavily in Colville and the surrounding areas with a goal to make the area the best connected on the peninsula, which is still on-going with trials of new gear that will enable even faster browsing, underway. This could not have been possible without

the help of the amazing community in and around Colville - for that i am truly grateful and hope we can continue to help get as many of you connected as possible and make Colville even more attractive to come and live.

One of my personal long term goals for the area is to give the opportunity to some young

people to come and learn and work for us, becoming our Tech on the ground - an industry

that you normally wouldn't be able to get the foot in the door with out moving to the big smoke.

August was a busy month with MEG out and about despite the winter weather kicking in.

#### Winter Lecture series

We had two highly regarded speakers travel to Coromandel Town for our annual Winter Lecture series. The Winter lecture series is held at the Peppertree restaurant, Coromandel town on a Sunday evening at 7pm. You can sit by the fire and listen to experts in their field.

First up we had Professor Bruce Clarkson, give a fascinating talk on bringing indigenous nature back to New Zealand cities and towns. Along with interesting information on how to ensure restoration projects are successful (FYI - you have to stick with them for a long time!) he also had some fabulous insights into how the lockdowns changed the landscape for native birds and other plants and wildlife.

We were also privileged to have Dr Ian Stringer talk about the work that earned him a NZ Order of Merit earlier this year. Dr Stringer was part of the dedicated team that worked on the Mercury Islands locating and ultimately saving the Tusked Wētā which was virtually extinct at the time. Thankfully the species is now thriving across many of the islands in the group.

We have our final lecture on 25<sup>th</sup> September with Dr Brendan Dunphy talking about

"What seabirds are telling us about our changing seas". We would love to see you there.
